SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Steady shift began with all of swing shift responding an industrial business for a report of two trespassers who had been chased by employees and were reportedly hiding in the business yard somewhere. A perimeter was set and a drone utilized but the suspects were not located. SCU made some warrant arrests and narcotic arrests throughout the night. An officer observed a motorcycle driving recklessly and pursued the motorcycle briefly before losing sight of it. The Sheriffs Office helicopter was already observing the same motorcycle because the suspect had led officers on pursuit throughout the county earlier. The air unit was able to watch the suspect enter an apartment and lead officers there. Announcements were given for the suspect to come out and after several minutes he surrendered. The motorcycle was located inside the apartment.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer saw a male standing outside a closed business. After contacting him it was determined he had two outstanding warrants. He was arrested and booked in jail. Officers responded to a call involving a male who was standing outside of his vehicle that was stopped in the middle of the road. The male had urinated on himself and was showing signs of intoxication. After a DUI investigation the male was determined to be driving while under the influence of alcohol. A criminal history report also showed he had more than three prior convictions for DUI. He was arrested and booked for the felony section. Officers also responded to a disturbance -possible assault & battery in-progress between a male and female. When officers arrived they on-viewed the incident and the involved male was non-complaint with the officers. After a short tussle with the male officers were able to get him in handcuffs. The investigation revealed the male had assaulted his wife, leaving several visible injuries. Additionally, the incident occurred after the male had got out of a vehicle he was driving with his three children inside. He was extremely intoxicated and refused to provide a breath sample for the DUI investigation. A blood draw warrant was obtained and he was booked into jail for domestic battery, DUI, child endangerment, and resisting arrest.
