An officer investigated a kidnap that occurred over a drug arrest earlier this week. The victim reported she was picked up by a male and female who she knows. The male started to accuse the victim of cooperating with police and providing information about the male's drug dealing. The male drove the female to an unknown location and was making statements that he was going to pull the victim's teeth out with plyers and cut her finger tips off with shears he had in his glove box. The female suspect pulled out a knife and demanded the victim's phone, money, and credit cards. All of this happened in a vehicle as the male suspect was driving. The victim was able to escape at some point and flagged down a motorist who gave the victim a ride to the CHP office in Atwater. A CHP officer transported the victim back to Turlock for the investigation, and two suspects are currently wanted for several felonies. Officers also responded to a commercial burglary at a closed gas station. The front glass door was smashed and the suspect(s) took several cigarettes and fled. A crowbar and hypodermic syringe was left on the ground in the store. There are no suspects at this time.
