SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Overall, it was a slow Sunday night. Officers responded to a hit & run accident in a parking lot that resulted from a domestic disturbance. The suspect driver was identified but not located. Later in the shift MPD requested a courtesy report for an assault & battery that occurred in Modesto. The victim was EMC getting treatment for her injuries. She was uncooperative and did not want to make a report of the battery. It was determined she also had an active Ramey warrant for her arrest out of the S.O. for home invasion robbery, assault with a firearm, conspiracy, and false imprisonment. Officers contacted her at the hospital and waited for her to be medically cleared before arresting her for the warrant and taking her to jail.
