2. SYNOPSIS:

This is a public hearing to approve one of the four proposed Council Redistricting Maps as provided by NDC Research and from input by the community from the previous three public hearings that were held regarding identifying "neighborhoods", "communities of interest", and "secondary areas.

3. DISCUSSION OF ISSUE:

Every ten years, cities with by-district election systems must use new census data to review and, if needed, redraw district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. This process, called redistricting, ensures all districts have nearly equal population. The redistricting process for the City of Turlock must be completed by April 17, 2021.

The City adopted its current district boundaries on June 10, 2014, based on 2010 census data as required by law. The districts must now be redrawn using the 2020 census data and in compliance with the FAIR MAPS Act, which was adopted by the California legislature as AB 849 and took effect January 1, 2020.

Under the Act, the council shall draw and adopt boundaries using the following criteria in the listed order of priority (Elections Code 21601(c) for general law cities / 21621(c) for charter cities):

- Comply with the federal requirements of equal population and the Voting Rights Act
- 2. Geographically contiguous
- 3. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest" (socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
- 4. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 5. Compact (do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)
- 6. Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party

Once the prioritized criteria are met, other traditional districting principles can be considered, such as:

- 1. Minimize the number of voters delayed from voting in 2022 to 2024
- 2. Respect voters' choices / continuity in office
- 3. Future population growth

By law, the City must hold at least four public hearings that enable community members to provide input on the drawing of district maps:

- At least one hearing must occur before the city or county draws draft maps
- At least two hearings must happen after the drawing of draft maps
- The fourth hearing can happen either before or after the drawing of draft maps
- City or county staff or consultants may hold a public workshop instead of one
 of the required public redistricting hearings

To increase the accessibility of these hearings, cities and counties must take the following steps:

- At least one hearing must occur on a Saturday, Sunday, or after 6 p.m. on a weekday
- If a redistricting hearing is consolidated with another local government meeting, the redistricting hearing portion must begin at a pre-designated time
- Local public redistricting hearings should be made accessible to people with disabilities

The purpose of this public hearing is to inform the public about the districting process and to hear from the community on what factors should be taken into consideration while creating district boundaries. The public is requested to provide input regarding communities of interest and other local factors—that should be considered while drafting district maps. A *community of interest* under the relevant Elections Code for cities (Section 21601(c) / 21621(c)] is "a population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation."

Possible features defining community of interest might include, but are not limited to:

- A. School attendance areas;
- B. Natural dividing lines such as major roads, hills, or highways;
- C. Areas around parks and other neighborhood landmarks;
- D. Common issues, neighborhood activities, or legislative/election concerns; and
- E. Shared demographic characteristics, such as:
 - (1) Similar levels of income, education, or linguistic insolation;
 - (2) Languages spoken at home; and
 - (3) Single-family and multi-family housing unit areas.

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IN THE MATTER OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TURLOCK ADJUSTING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FIVE CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS AND ADOPTING A NEW OFFICIAL COUNCIL DISCTRICT MAP FOR THE CITY OF TURLOCK BASED ON THE RESULTS OF THE 2020 DECENNIAL CENSUS AND AMENDING THE TURLOCK MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 2, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 06 "ESTABLISHMENT OF COUNCIL DISTRICTS"

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2014, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 1197-CS pursuant to Government Code Sections 34871 to add Title 2, Chapter 1 to the Turlock Municipal Code to provide for the by-district election of members of the City Council, adopt the official Council District Map for the City of Turlock, establish the boundaries and identification number of each electoral district, and establish a sequencing of elections for each Council District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code Section 21601 and Section 2-1-06 "Establishment of Council Districts" of the Turlock Municipal Code, the City Council is required to adjust the boundaries of any or all of the Council Districts following each decennial federal census. Using the census as a basis, the City Council must adjust the boundaries so that the Council Districts are as equal in population as practicable and in compliance with all applicable provisions of the law, including the United States and Federal Constitutions and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (52 U.S.C. Section 10301 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Elections Code Section 21607 and 21607.1, the City Council held public hearings on the drawing of district boundaries on: October 18, 2021 (1st Pre-Draft Public Hearing), November 8, 2021 (2nd Pre-Draft Public Hearing), January 25, 2022 (1st Post-Draft Public Hearing), and March 22, 2022 (2nd Post-Draft Public Hearing). At each of the foregoing hearings, the public was invited to provide input on the composition of the new Council district boundaries. The proposed maps of the district boundaries were published on January 26, 2022 on the City's redistricting webpage at www.redistrictturlock.org; and

WHEREAS, after closing the public hearing held on March 22, 2022, the City Council selected the map depicted in Exhibit "A" of this Resolution as the official Council District Map for the City of Turlock and adopted this Resolution. Demographic data supporting the map based on the 2020 Census is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" of this Resolution and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the map attached hereto as Exhibit "A" to this Resolution, and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby approved and adopted as the Official Council District Map for the City of Turlock and shall be used in the 2022 general municipal

election and all such elections for City Council thereafter, until further amended; and

WHEREAS, if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Resolution shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of Turlock hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this Resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Turlock does hereby adjust the boundaries of the five City Council Districts and adopt a new official Council District Map for the City of Turlock based on the results of the 2020 Decennial Census and amend the Turlock Municipal Code Title 2, Chapter 1, Section 06 "Establishment of Council Districts."

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT: Title 2, Chapter 1, Section 06 "Establishment of Council Districts" to read as follows:

2-1-06 Establishment of Council Districts

Five (5) City Council districts are hereby established in the city. The boundaries and identifying number of each district shall be as described on the official "Council District Map" on file in the Office of the City Clerk as adopted by this Ordinance No. ____-CS and Resolution No. 2022-___.

SECTION 2. VALIDITY: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Resolution shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of Turlock hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this Resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable.

SECTION 3. ENACTMENT: This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage by the City Council. Prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days from the passage and adoption thereof, this ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the County of Stanislaus, State of California, together with names of the members of the City Council voting for and against the same.
